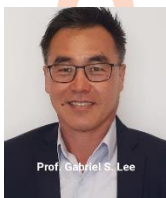

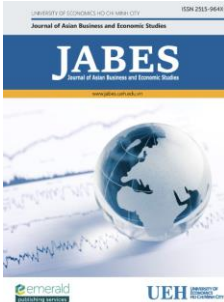

- Please be noted that ACBES 2024 charge registration fee per person and per article.
- The accepted author needs to pay two times if they have two accepted papers.
- In case there are more than one author per paper wants to participate with us, we will collect registration fee per author.

### Author No Shows

- ACBES enforces a “No Show” policy. Any accepted paper included in the final program is expected to have at least one author to attend and present the paper at the conference.
- Authors of the accepted papers included in the final program who do not attend the ACBES will be subscribed to a “No Show List”, compiled by Committee. The “No Show List” will also be made available to JABES Editors and ACBES Committee, who can reject submissions from these authors in the following two years, based on their past negative impact on ACBES.

## Paper Submission

### A. Submission Preparation Checklist

As part of the submission process, authors are required to check off their submission's compliance with all of the following items, and submissions may be returned to authors that do not adhere to these guidelines.

1. The submission has not been previously published, nor is it before another journal for consideration (or an explanation has been provided in Comments to the Editor).
2. The submission file is in OpenOffice, Microsoft Word, or RTF document file format.
3. Where available, URLs for the references have been provided.
4. The text is single-spaced; uses a 12-point font; employs italics, rather than underlining (except with URL addresses); and all illustrations, figures, and tables are placed within the text at the appropriate points, rather than at the end.
5. The text adheres to the stylistic and bibliographic requirements outlined in the Author Guidelines.
6. An abstract without a draft paper may be considered (although priority will be given to submissions with a draft paper).
7. Please prepare two separate files: The Title page and the Full manuscript. We only accept manuscripts in English.

### B. International Conference Format

To submit a manuscript, authors need to prepare the following documents:

List of authors and all information including: Full name, affiliation, email address (author must ensure that all necessary information is included and arranged properly before submitting the paper to the system). After submitting paper, the author cannot change any information about the authors.
  - c. Abstract

  - f. Acknowledgements (if any)
  - g. Permission to use copyright material from other sources (if any)

### **C. Doctoral Colloquium Format**

Applicants to the Doctoral Colloquium should submit:

1. A four-page summary of their PhD research, covering the problem, methodology, research plan, progress to date, and questions/feedback desired from DC panellists. The four-page limit does not include references, tables, and figures.
2. The structure should follow the format used by most universities for a dissertation proposal: an Introduction, a Related Work, Preliminary Methods, Preliminary Results, Proposed Work, Discussion, Questions for the Panel, and Conclusion.
3. The summary should address the following themes as appropriate according to stage of development:
  - a. The academic issue being studied
  - b. Why the issue is important both academically and practically
  - c. The concepts, theory, and frameworks being used
  - d. The methodology being used
  - e. The anticipated contribution to knowledge
  - f. Progress to date (including preliminary result and findings)
  - g. The next steps in the research process
  - h. One or two specific issues which you would like feedback from the panel
4. Format of Summary:
  - a. Microsoft Word document
  - b. A4 size
  - c. Time New Roman 12-point font
  - d. Single spacing

- e. 2.5 cm (1 inch) margins
  - f. Harvard style referencing
  - g. No footnotes
  - h. Figures and table integrated into the text
  - i. One complete file only with the file name:  
student's surname\_colloquium
5. Submissions should be sent in MS Word format or PDF format
  6. Please prepare two separate files: The Title page and the Full manuscript. We only accept manuscripts in English.
  7. In the title page: include on the first page of your submission the following information:
    - a. Title
    - b. Authors' names, affiliations (University and Nation), and contact information including e-mail addresses for all authors.
    - c. You must add all co-authors and make sure of the order of all co-authors when generating your submissions.
    - d. Abstract and keywords, JEL Code. Please check your JEL Code here: <https://www.aeaweb.org/econlit/jelCodes.php?view=jel>
    - e. Please note that the Abstract is a must-have with a maximum of 250 words

#### **D. Community Services and Social Activities Format**

1. When submitting participant registration for the 2nd ICONICS community service dissemination, an abstract must be uploaded.
2. There will be e-proceedings, so complete manuscripts must be collected for participants whose papers are declared accepted for dissemination.
3. Both the Abstract and the full manuscript must be written in English.
4. In the title page, include on the first page of your submission the following information:
  - a. Title

- b. Authors' names, affiliations (University and Nation), and contact information, including e-mail addresses for all authors.
5. You must add all co-authors and make sure of the order of all co-authors when generating your submissions.
6. The Abstract must not exceed 250 words, which is the essence of the scientific article.
7. The Abstract contains objectives, methods, results, conclusions, and implications.
8. Abstract Writing is written in one paragraph with a column format and font size of 12 pt., aligned right and left (justify). Do not use symbols, special characters, footnotes, or mathematical equations in the Abstract.
9. Maximum 5 keywords sorted alphabetically and separated by commas.

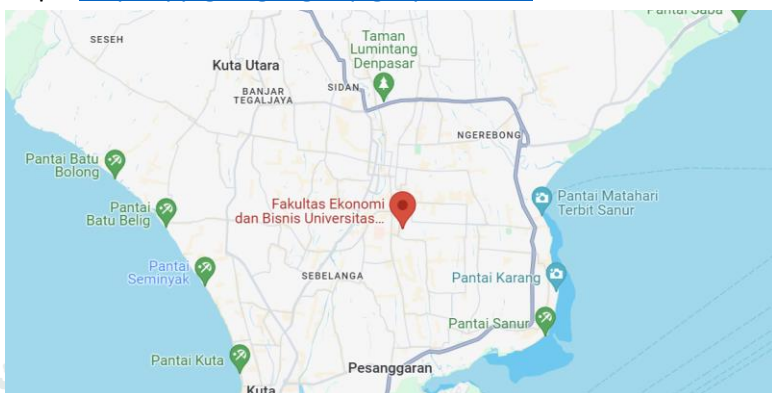

# VISA

## Indonesian Visas

### A. Activities

1. Tourism,
2. Family,
3. Continuing travel to other countries.

### B. Description of Activities

Visiting a specific location for recreational, personal development, or educational purposes that involves exploring the unique features of the tourist attraction, encompassing experiences such as traveling by yacht, or participating in meetings, incentives, conventions, and exhibitions.

### C. Rights

1. Engaging in activities related to tourism, and visiting family or friends,
2. Participating in meetings, incentives, conventions, and exhibitions as an attendee.

### D. Obligation

1. Obeying the laws and regulations,
2. Respecting customs, culture, and local wisdom,
3. Having sufficient living expenses while in Indonesia.

### E. Prohibition

1. Residing in the Indonesian territory beyond the stay permit period,
2. Engaging in the sale of goods or services,
3. Receiving compensation, wages, or equivalent from individuals or corporations in Indonesia.

### F. Visa Type and Duration of Stay

Visa on Arrival 30 Days, extendable.

### G. Visa Application Centre

Immigration Checkpoints (airports, ports, or land borders) upon the arrival of Foreign Nationals.



## H. Visa Application Requirements

1. National passport that is valid for at least 6 months;
2. Return ticket or onward ticket to continue the journey to another country (except for crew members of a conveyance who will stop to join a ship and continue the journey to another country);
3. Proof of payment of immigration fees according to the provisions of laws and regulations.

## I. Other Terms and Conditions

Stateless Foreign Nationals and Foreign Nationals holding travel documents (other than national passports) such as temporary passports, emergency passports, titre du voyage, certificate of identity, laissez-passer, or similar documents must provide a Re-Entry Permit to the country where the Visit Visa is applied for, along with a return ticket or onward ticket to another country (except for transportation crew).

The visa validity period is 90 days from the date of issue. If not used within the timeframe, Foreign Nationals must apply for a new visa to enter Indonesia.

## J. Visa Application and Issuance Process

### J.1 Visa Application Mechanism:

1. The submission of visa application through the [evisa.imigrasi.go.id](https://evisa.imigrasi.go.id) application and immigration fee payment is made abroad;
2. The submission of visa application through the [evisa.imigrasi.go.id](https://evisa.imigrasi.go.id) application is made abroad or before immigration inspection, and immigration fee payment is made in Indonesian territory; or
3. The submission of visa application and immigration fee payment is made in Indonesian territory.

### J.2 Granting Mechanism:

1. Verification of requirements completeness;
2. Verification of immigration fee payment following the laws and regulations;
3. Profile creation and verification;
4. Approval;
5. Affixing the Visit Visa sticker upon Arrival and/or Entry Stamp and Stay Permit for the Visit Visa holder upon Arrival on travel documents.

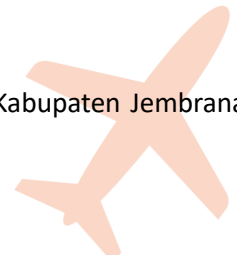
